Meridian would like to inform you of our planed road closures at Benmore or Aviemore over October. This work is subject to date changes, but notification will be sent to all road users prior to the close.

28 October (Thursday) - BENMORE Dam road closed for stoplog removal. The road will be closed to ALL traffic (motorised, peddle power and walking traffic) due to open hatches, large loads and cranes working overhead. This work will be between 0800 to 1300.

30 October (Saturday) – BENMORE Dam road closed for intake screen change out. The road will be closed to ALL traffic (motorised, peddle power and walking traffic) due to open hatches, large loads and cranes working overhead. This work will be between 0700 to 1900.

The road closed applies to **ALL** traffic including: motorised, peddle power and walking traffic. We will have cranes and open hatches in the road way which make it dangerous for the general public to pass though. 

Wacky Wednesday

Coming back to school and we are straight into it and our first activity was a wacky hair day. Everyone came with crazy hair; we had some plates in peoples hair, hair chalk, and all sorts of things. The point of Wacky Hair Day was to raise money for the Child Cancer Society. In total we ended up collecting \$167.30. A few students said they enjoyed being able to style their hair in wacky ways they wouldn't normally do. They also mentioned that they were happy to give a donation to the Child Cancer Society because they knew it would help other kids get better treatment or be put towards equipment to help them recover. We had a positive response from everyone and they all said they really enjoyed Wacky Hair Day.

Weather events (drought, flood, wind, snow), financial or family distress, uncaring government decisions (many without thought of the long-term consequences), disease (whether it be Covid-149 or M. Bovis), earthquakes; all happenings we cannot change. Except rail into the darkness. Internalisation of issues occurs. Where they might fester. NZ has the second-highest youth suicide in any OECD country; rural suicides remain unacceptably high.

We may begin to see no escape. Seeking professional help may not be a personal choice. Such is the stigma and discrimination attached to the 'words' mental health', no matter the extraordinary work achieved by John Kirwin and Mike King. We might feel our wholeness as a human diminishes. We believe we fail. The very thought of 'mental health' deepens the internalisation to where a simple accident such as dropping a cup on the floor can set off a chain reaction.

How about we change the understanding – or description - of mental health to that of Mental Healthiness. If we become aware of something – no matter what that something is - outside or inside ourselves, we start taking control. Healthiness means we can make that first remedial step – the one attention to understanding gives.



Creativity; we all have it. Using it is another matter. It is a matter of selfbelief, not one of ability. A line drawn on a blank page is art; a second intersecting line may be people joining. Colour those lines and the picture may represent humanity. You are the artist. It is not up to others to question. Those who feel in a likewise manner surround us to talk about whatever in a non-judgemental environment. It is that finding a quiet place at home to finish your masterpiece, one that is unsullied by the world around us. A peer-support worker links people with services designed to complement and supplement an individual. They support

across all health disciplines. A mentor can be a teacher, coach, or individual who can offer advice or support.

The main principles of intentional peer support are learning and growing, caring, building relationships, and moving towards wellness. We recognise mutuality and that we are in this together, and that you're not alone. By meeting people with similar stories, we create hope and connection.

We design our creative projects to be easy and accessible for everyone. Using art and craft as a tool to connect people, we can try something new, break up our routine and find satisfaction and joy in trying out new processes.

Thus, we come to the Waitaki Creative Wellbeing project. Hosted by a peer-support worker and an artistic mentor, it is an outreach project funded by the Ministry of Culture & Heritage and supported by the Waitaki District Council. Free, weekly classes occur in the Kurow Info Centre (Mondays), Palmerston



Community Centre (Tuesdays) and Oamaru's Ara Campus (Wednesdays) between 12.30 and 3pm. They are a haven of peace where talk, laughter and creativity function in a safe, supportive environment. No requirement exists to open up and talk, only to enjoy learning new skills. No experience needed! Simply a need to wonder at what is achievable with the proper tutor-led guidance. All classes are confidential.

Virus; A Brief History

Medical terminology can create considerable confusion due to similarities between like-sounding words such as - in today's Covid world - **epidemic**, **pandemic** and **endemic**.

An **epidemic** is a disease affecting large numbers of people in a specific region or community. Whilst confined to the Wuhan area, Covid-19 was an **epidemic**.

A **pandemic** is an **epidemic** with a passport – one that defies borders by travelling internationally. Once Covid-19 left Wuhan by plane, it became a **pandemic**.

An **endemic** is neither of these, instead being something confined to a particular people or country. Malaria – for example - is **endemic** to Africa and other Asian countries.



The Black Death

"First, they felt pain all over their body. Next, a lump -- sometimes as small as pea, other times as big as an apple -- protruded from their skin. Then, as the disease spread throughout their body, they coughed up blood. Finally -- for many of them -- came death. That was how people hundreds of years ago described the Black Death, which began sweeping across Europe in the 14th century, killing up to 60% of the continent's population in one of the worst pandemics in human history.

Today, many of us think of the plague as something confined to the history books -- a grim symbol of the medieval period, before doctors knew about the existence of viruses or bacteria."

Enduring for seven years from 1346, up to 200 million people may have died due to the Black Death - technically referred to as the bubonic plague pandemic - making it the deadliest pandemic in history. Carried by a species of flea, it spread from Asia to Europe, creating devastation.

The first known epidemic (unknown cause) occurred around 5,000 years ago in the Hamin Mangha and Miaozigou areas of Northeast China, where several villages were wiped out.

Known as the Plague of Athens, one of the first known plague-like events occurred in 430 B.C. and killed around 100,000 people.

In the past 500 years, about fifteen flu pandemics have occurred. In all probability, the Spanish Flu of 1918/1919 was the first genuinely international pandemic. Whilst the exact origin of this Avian Flu remains disputed, it was not Spain. Countries such as the United States, France and China were all implicated. Following World War 1, a news blackout occurred, discouraging coverage of this new –yet unexplained – medical threat. Allied governments felt that such news would destroy what little morale remained in Europe.

Because of Spain's neutrality during World War 1, its media began openly reporting the increasing death toll in their country. Thus, 'Spanish' Flu became synonymous with the disease. (Except in Spain, where it was known as the 'French' Flu!)

Its rapid international spread was attributed to soldiers returning to their home countries. An estimated fifty million people died. Arriving in New Zealand in October 1918, the Flu showed no mercy to those of all ages. About 9,000 New Zealanders died within two months – just shy of 9% of

New Zealand's population at the time; half as many as lost their lives during the entire war.

Children adapted a song from the 1889–90 flu pandemic into a skipping-rope rhyme which became popular in 1918.

I had a little bird, its name was Enza. I opened the window, and in-flu-enza.

The flu claimed around 83 lives in the North Otago area – Waitaki 22, Hampden 4, Oamaru 46, Waihemo 6, Palmerston – 5. "One action taken in many towns and cities was to set up inhalation sprayers that dispersed a solution of zinc sulphate. Though 'medically useless', this was the only approved preventative for influenza known to New Zealand's Public Health Department. Most sprayers were set up in public buildings." Once the flu was declared a medical emergency similar actions to those taken today against Covid were enacted.

In 1918, it was unknown that a virus caused influenza. Doctors believed it to be bacterial. Medical researchers did not find that conclusive proof until 1933 – forty years before the first antiviral medication became available. It was not until 1928 that Alexander Fleming first isolated what would become the first antibiotic – Penicillin.

So. What is the difference? Less than 1% of bacteria - found almost everywhere - can cause human disease; most treatable by antibiotics. Reproduction is by cell division.

A virus - around 100 times smaller than an antibiotic - needs a living host to survive; treatable with antiviral medication. Reproduction is within living cells which is why antibiotics are not effective.

The treatment regimens are NOT interchangeable. Seldom will a doctor prescribe an antibiotic for a viral infection unless it is prophylactically. In other words, to prevent a potential bacterial infection
