



For many years now our volunteers have been slogging away with weed eaters and mowers valiantly maintaining the pedestrian section of the Duntroon wetland's walkway. Honourable mention must go to Geoff Keeling and Colin Martin for devoting so much time and energy to this task.

With an eye to the future, the Duntroon and District Development Association (DDDA) decided to apply for funding for a person to take over this work. It is therefore very gratifying to receive funding from Environment Canterbury from the Lower Waitaki South Coastal Zone Action Plan budget.

This will free Geoff and Colin for other tasks, not a holiday as they may have hoped, ha ha. Seriously, we are very grateful for their many hours of hard work and thank Environment Canterbury for their support.



wines, Waitaki wines, or just wine in general. We love to teach, so don't be shy. And if that is not your drop, we do carry a selection of Altitude beers, cause we know, nothing replaces a beer after a long day fishing or a stint up Kurow hill on a hot day.

The English

Yes, I know that play on words will have most readers hanging their heads. But such is the way of the English language. So many words have so many different meanings. It is little wonder that English is one of the more difficult languages to learn. (Arabic and Japanese take the lead in difficulty.) Take the word 'set' for example. It has 430 meanings or connotations listed in the second edition (pub. 1989) of the Oxford English Dictionary. The word also has the most extended entry in the dictionary at 60,000 words, equalling 326,000 characters.

So. Where did all this start? How did English grow from an insignificant language in the 1600s, spoken only in the British Isles by around four million people, to become the most dominant language in the world, with around 1.5 billion speakers today? Luck. Pure, blind luck.

According to the Cambridge Dictionary, lingua franca means a language used for communication between groups of people who speak different languages. For centuries, the lingua franca was French. (This does not preclude a person's native tongue.) If a person could not speak French, then business, political and other communications could not happen. It was also the language of royalty. English was the language of the peasantry! The top ten spoken languages depend upon the website one accesses! However, the consensus

is English 1.5 b, Mandarin 1.2 b, Hindi 600 m, Spanish 500 m, Arabic 372 m, French 300 m, Bengali 265 m, Russian 258 m, Portuguese 223 m and Swahili and Indonesian 200 m. Mandarin, Hindi, Arabic, Bengali, and Swahili are language names that do not identify with a country's name. For example, Chinese is not a spoken language. It is a written language with two forms – Simplified (Official language, read left to right) and Traditional (read right to left and top to bottom). Chinese spoken languages are Mandarin, Cantonese, and over 40 different dialects. A Mandarin speaker cannot understand a Cantonese speaker.

But, back to English. **West Germanic languages are a** group of Germanic languages that developed in the region of the North Sea, Rhine-Weser, and Elbe. Out of the many local West Germanic dialects, six modern standard languages have arisen: English, Frisian, Dutch, Afrikaans, German and Yiddish. English and Fri-



sian descend from North Sea Germanic. English has two other fundamental characteristics: flexibility of function and openness of vocabulary.



Flexibility of function has grown over the last five centuries. Words formerly distinguished as nouns or verbs by differences in their forms are now often used as both nouns and verbs. One can speak, for example, of *planning a table* or *tabling a plan*, *booking a place* or *placing a book*, *lifting a thumb* or *thumbing a lift*. In the other Indo-European languages, apart from rare exceptions in Scandinavian languages, nouns and verbs are never identical because of the necessity of separate noun and verb endings. (The male and female versions of words which drove us up the wall at school trying to learn!)



And then, along came a guy named William Shakespeare. But, more on him next year.

#### **KUROW POLICE - SEASON'S GREETINGS**

Season's Greetings to all and best wishes for fast approaching Xmas. As the year wraps up I'd like tocomment on a couple of things that happened this year and some ideas on keeping ourselves and our property safe this holiday season.

During January/February 2022 there was a spate of burglaries at campsites in Fisherman's Bend and Waitangi areas. As the matters are still before the Court it is limited what I can say but court appearances will continue and I do not expect verdicts until mid 2024. Happily this week one of the defendant's pleaded guilty to Burglary and part of his sentence, along with returning the stolen caravan, is to pay over \$6000 reparation to the victim. Id have to say I am very happy with this result. It's a long road but these four arrests appear to have stopped the burglaries.

The court process has shown again how important it is to be able to identify goods you report as stolen. This can be by serial number, secret marking or possibly photograph. By way of example ...say I seize a 50 inch Samsung TV in a search warrant... you say it's your stolen TV while the suspect says he bought it on Facebook. A judge is most unlikely to agree it is your TV unless you can provide some extra evidence like a serial number or your initials scratched on one of the TV feet etc...one black flatscreen looks just like any other. Proving theft or burglary can be very challenging. I'd say you won't regret spending an hour or two this summer recording serial numbers or otherwise marking your property for identification purposes.

Camping is not what it was 'back in the day' when a canvas tent, chilly bin, sleeping bags and a barbie was all you needed. Now many sites have expensive TV, Sky, solar power units, generators, califonts, jetskis etc...remaining on the campsite all season. Please remember this creates a temptation for burglars who routinely steal these goods to order. I recommend the best way to protect your valuable belongings is either take the valuable items home, mark your goods for identity purposes and join the growing wave of campers installing solar powered security cameras. This is making a difference and instrumental in catching four Waitaki lakes burglars who are before the court at the moment.

Last week on my way back from Oamaru Police Station I received a call to say someone was smashing their way into the Kurow Police Station. They had smashed the rear window in-between the house and the station and were attempting to get in and retrieve their car keys and then motor vehicle. This happened while my wife Susan was at home and only metres away.

Susan confronted the man and stopped him entering the station. "Uni" the German Shepherd was with Susan and helped restore order with a look only a shepherd can give. A big thankyou to the neighbours next door at Hakataramea Motors and the builders at Whalen Lodge who made their way urgently to the station when they were told of the breakin. Susan and I really appreciated your assistance. What a great town!

As always if you need help during the holiday period you can call 111 for emergencies (if you need immediate help) or 105 for non urgent matters. I will be working right through and a team of traffic and general duties staff will be working night and day shifts in the valley as usual.

Enjoy the festive season and summer break and please plan how you're going to get home after any celebrations.




